Patricia A First Reading The Book of Daniel Inclusive Bible

7:1 Beginning in the first year of the reign of Belzhazzar in Babylon, Daniel had visions in his sleep. What follows are his narratives of those dreams.

(As his dream unfolds in 7:2-8, our reading is from 7:9-10 and 13-14)

(9-10) Thrones were set up, and the one who sat there was the Ancient of Days, whose clothing was snow white, with a head of hair as white as wool; whose throne was flames of fire.

A stream of fire surged forth, flowing from the Ancient One's presence, with tens of thousands ministering, with hundreds of thousands standing in attendance. The court was convened and the books were open.

(13-14) I gazed into the visions of the night once again, and I saw, coming on the clouds of heaven, one who looked human, but somehow more than human. This One cane to the Ancient One and was led into the Divine Presence. Thus was conferred sovereignty, glory and dominion, and all peoples, nations and languages became this One's subjects. This Sovereignty is an eternal Sovereignty which will never pass away, nor will this dominion ever be destroyed.
