The Ringing of the Bell

Prelude

*Carol "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" New Century Hymnal #116, vss. 1,2

O come, O come, Emmanuel and ransom captive Israel that mourns in lonely exile here, until the Child of God appears. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel!

O come, O Wisdom from on high, and order all things far and nigh; to us the path of knowledge show, and help us in that way to go. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel.

The First Lesson is from John's Prologue (Sue Lanchantin)

In the beginning – everything began! And before everything began, there was God. God was before – before everything. The Holy Spirit and Christ were there, too. Jesus brought Christ into this world in a very special way that changed everything. Everything. The Light that Jesus brought into the world reminds us that this Light is always with us – in us! Yes, we are "People of the Light; People of the Love and the Hope and the Joy and the Peace". So, we begin this evening with lighting a symbol of that Light, Love, Hope, Peace, and Joy for all to see: the Christ Candle at the Center of our Advent Wreath.

Lighting of the Christ Candle

*Carol "One Candle is Lit"

Come, listen, the sounds of God with us ring clear, And signs of a cross in the distance appear. The Word once made flesh, yet the Word ever near. One candle is lit for the Christ birthday here.

Second Lesson recalls John the Baptist's words (Abigail Langlan)

Listen to the call of John the Baptist's voice in your heart:

"I am the voice shouting in the desert: Get the road ready for the One to come; make the path straight and clear for this One to travel! Every valley must be filled up and leveled out, even-out the hills and the mountains! Nothing can be in the way! No winding roads, no rough paths. Make it easy for everyone to see the coming of the One. The One who will reveal God to this world, a world sorely in need of God!"

Imagine John the Baptist saying these things to those he baptized in the Jordan River that day, adding:

"And, while I baptize you with water at this river's bank, the One to come will baptize you with the Holy Spirit, bringing Love, Hope, Joy and Peace for this world. Be ready! The time is come..."

Come, O long-expected Jesus, born to set all people free; from our fears and sins release us; grant us your true liberty.

Israel's strength and consolation, hope to all the earth impart; dear desire of every nation, enter every longing heart.

Third Lesson - The Angel appears to Mary (Laura Langlan)

Now, even though it seems like yesterday, this happened in the town of Nazareth in a place called Galilee more than two thousand years ago.

A Messenger of God, the Archangel Gabriel appeared suddenly to a young woman named Mary. Mary was engaged to Joseph, a man whose family dated back to the time of David, a famous and important ruler of Judea.

The appearance of the angel startled Mary, as it would anyone! The angel's words were even more startling: "God is with you, Mary, and you are the most fortunate of all women!"

Mary was frightened and wondered what this all meant. And the angel surprised her even more by saying, "God has chosen you, Mary, to be the mother of a child, a son, whom you will name Jesus."

Trying hard to understand all that was happening but not quite able to believe it, Mary told the angel that this was simply not possible. Then the angel said the words that would be repeated until time ceases to be, "Mary, everything is possible with God."

And Mary was changed in a way she could hardly understand; suddenly, fear was no longer with her; she bowed in respect to the messenger and said, "I will follow God's will; I place my life in God's care." And when she looked up – no one was there. The angel—had gone. And God, as before, was with her.

Mary, woman of the promise; vessel of your people's dreams: through your open, willing spirit waters of God's good news streamed.

Mary song of holy wisdom sung before the world began: faithful to the Word within you, as you bore God's wondrous plan. Mary, morning star of justice; mirror of the Radiant Light: in the shadows of life's journey, be a beacon for our sight.

Mary, woman of the gospel; humble home for treasured seed: help us to be true disciples, bearing fruit in word and deed.

Fourth Lesson tells of the night when Jesus is born (Ramsaywak Family)

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered so taxes and more could be collected. He wanted to know how many people were on Earth, what their names were, where they lived, how many children they had and so forth. His decree required that everyone travel to the towns where their families were from and register in the census he demanded.

Obeying the law of the emperor, Joseph took Mary to Bethlehem, because that is where his descendants had originally settled. How far was it to Bethlehem? From Nazareth it was a long and hard trip - about 120 miles, and they traveled by donkey and on foot with others who were on the same journey.

At that time, Mary was engaged to Joseph and expecting a child. She was very pregnant and close to having her baby. While they were in Bethlehem, Mary's time arrived, and she gave birth to Jesus. It was there, in Bethlehem, that the child was wrapped in cloth and born in a manger where animals and their keepers stayed, because as we are told – there was no room in the inn.

Fifth Lesson - Angels appear to the shepherds (Jeff Newcombe)

While all this was happening, some distance away - other angels, other messengers of God suddenly appeared before a group of shepherds. We are told that the glory of God shined so brightly in them that the shepherds were terrified! They didn't know what to do...

But the messengers calmed them, saying:

"Do not be afraid; Listen! We bring you good news of great joy for everyone! To you, to this nation and to all the world – on this day in the city of David - a child is born. A child of God; the one you have been waiting for – the Messiah." [The one who will become known as Jesus, Emmanuel, God-with-Us.]

Then the angels told them, "This is how you will be able to find him: the infant will be in a manger wrapped in cloth. You will know this child when you see him!"

It was all so amazing! Suddenly, as if the heavens and nature and stars could sing, these words were heard echoing, *resounding* all around them:

"Glory to God in the highest and peace to all on earth, for the child is born."

Then, the angels departed as mysteriously as they had come. The shepherds looked at each other shocked and in wonder. All at once they said together, "Let's go, *now*! Let's go and see this for ourselves!" And, so, they went, and just as they had been told, they found Mary and Joseph and Jesus, and they we in awe of all that had transpired and what they saw.

Sixth Lesson - The Wise Travelers and the Star (Matthew Lypen)

News of the birth of the child, the appearance of messengers and the strange star spread quickly. Travelers from everywhere were talking all about it. Word of the birth of Jesus, *a newborn ruler*, even got to King Herod - the cruel and jealous ruler of the time.

At one point, the Wise Travelers passed through Herod's court, asking for directions to find this child. They had been following the star and wondered if anyone knew where it led.

Well, Herod and much of Jerusalem were already frightened by all these strange occurrences being reported. King Herod called together his high priests and the scribes and asked them what they thought was going on. "Could this be the Messiah?" he asked.

The high priests and scribes told Herod that according to scriptures and the prophets, the Messiah would be born in Bethlehem – in the direction of the star. That was enough for Herod. He was going to end this threat to him and his power as soon as he could.

Making believe that he wanted to celebrate the birth of this amazing child, Herod called the Wise Travelers to him and asked them to tell him when they found the child so he, too, could go and worship him. They agreed to do this and went on their way, following the star until it stopped over the place where the child was - and there they found Jesus.

Upon finding the baby Jesus, they were overcome with joy. They embraced the family and presented them with the gifts they had brought. They were in awe and amazement the whole time.

The angels directed them to travel home by a different route; so they did. They made their way home leaving King Herod angry at being out maneuvered.

There was another dream, too. This one for Joseph. An angel told Joseph not to go back to Nazareth, because King Herod would surely know of his arrival and attempt to kill Jesus there. Instead, the angel told Joseph to take his family to Egypt where they would be safe. They were to wait there until the angel returned, telling them it was all clear to return to Nazareth.

And so it was that Joseph and Mary and Jesus and their young family stayed in Egypt until Herod had died and the angel told them it was time to return home.

All this and more was held in the hearts of everyone; it was all remembered, especially the voices that sung that night in the heavens and have continued to this day to sing in all our hearts.
