

apocrypha, (from Greek apokryptein, "to hide away"), in biblical literature, works outside an accepted canon of scripture. ... In its broadest sense apocrypha has come to mean any writings of dubious authority.

This list of the Books of the Bible come from the 1769 Edition of the King James Bible

The Apocrypha are books of the Bible for which there are no copies written in Hebrew. They are all primarily in Greek, written in the few hundred years before the Birth of Christ. Since there is no Hebrew validation for these books, Judaism does not consider them to be inspired.

In the Fourth Century when St. Jerome translated the Bible into Latin (called the Vulgate), he did not want to exclude these books, which were used widely in Christian worship. So, he collected them in a separate section called "The Apocrypha".

Eventually, Roman Catholic and Orthodox traditions embraced these readings, removing them from a separate section.

Protestants continue to categorize The Apocrypha as a separate sections, following the Martin Luther translation into German.
