This morning's reading is from the second book of the Bible, The Book of Exodus as it continues the story began in Genesis. Exodus tells of the time when the Isaraelits left captivity under the Egyptians as a result of God's intervention through Moses:

First Reading Exodus 3:13-17

"But," Moses said to God, "When I go to the children of Israel and say to them, 'The God of your ancestors has sent me to you,' if they ask me, 'What is this god's name?' what am I to tell them?" ¹⁴ God replied, "I am as I am . This is what you will tell the Israelites: 'I am has sent me to you.'"

15 God spoke further to Moses: "Tell the children of Israel: 'Yhwh, the 'I am,' the God of your ancestors, the God of Sarah and Abraham, of Rebecca and Isaac, of Leah and Rachel and Jacob, has sent me to you.'This is my name forever; this is the name you are to remember for all generations. ¹⁶ "Now go. Gather the elders of the Israelites and tell them, 'I am, the God of your ancestors, appeared to me—the God of Sarah and Abraham, the God of Rebecca and Isaac, the God of Leah and Rachel and Jacob—and said: 'I have heard you and I have seen the way you are being treated in Egypt. ¹⁷ I tell you now that I will lead you out of your oppression in Egypt into the land of the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Amorites, the Perizzites, the Hivites and the Jebusites, to a land flowing with milk and honey.'"
