Call to Worship & Lighting of the Candle

Liturgist:

Today is the first Sunday of Advent. In a moment, we will light the first candle on our Advent wreath: the candle of Hope.

In the time before the birth of Jesus, the Israelites had little hope for the future of their nation or their people, except for the power of God that remained strong in their lives, even as it wavered from time-to-time. They awaited the "One who would come; a messiah, an anointed leader, like David. They believed when that happened, all would be well – again."

Today begins our 2022 Advent journey as we anticipate the birth of Jesus, the one who is called the Light of the World and the Hope of the Nations.

As we light the candle of Hope, we give thanks for all who ceaselessly and courageously speak words of hope and encouragement and love for each of us and this world, in the name of the one called Jesus.
