Gospel Reading Matthew 11:2-14

This morning's gospel reading is from Matthew, Chapter 11, Verses 2-14; Please listen with your heart and your mind for the meaning these words may have for you today...

By now, John had been locked up in prison. "Are you truly the One?" John told his disciples to ask Jesus.

Jesus told John's disciples, "Tell John what's going on:

Unseen people are seeing,

Those who could not walk are walking,

Illnesses are being healed,

Those who could not hear now hear,

Those thought dead live,

The poor and oppressed are learning that God is on their side."

When John's disciples left to report to John, Jesus started talking to the crowd about him. "What did you expect when you went out to see him in the wild? A prophet? Then you were right. That's right, John is a prophet! Probably the best prophet you'll ever hear. He is the prophet that another prophet Malachi talked about when he wrote, 'I'm sending my prophet ahead of you, to make the road smooth for you.'

"Let me tell you what's going on here: No one in history is better than John the Baptist; but in the kingdom he prepared you for, the lowliest person is ahead of him. That's how amazing the kingdom will be.

“For a long time now, people have tried to force themselves into God’s kindom. But if you read the books of the Prophets and God’s Law closely, you will see all the books and laws finishing in the words and works of John, coming together in him, preparing the way for the Messiah.

“He is the one you have been expecting to announce the Messiah.”
