First Reading 1 Corinthians 2:1-12 (13-16)

As for myself – friends and kin – when I came to you I did not come proclaiming God's testimony with any particular eloquence or wisdom. No, I determined that while I was with you I would know nothing but Jesus Christ—Christ crucified. When I came among you, it was in weakness and fear, and with much trepidation. My message and my preaching did not rest on philosophical arguments, but on the convincing power of the Spirit. As a consequence, your faith rests not on human wisdom, but on the power of God.

Still, there is a certain wisdom which we express among the spiritually mature. It is not a wisdom of this age, however, nor of the rulers of this age, who are headed for destruction. No, what we utter is God's wisdom: a mysterious, hidden wisdom. God planned it before all ages for our glory. None of the rulers of this age knew the mystery; if they had known it, they would never have crucified the Sovereign of Glory. Of this wisdom it is written,

"Eye has not seen, ear has not heard, nor has it so much as dawned on anyone what God has prepared for those who love God."

Yet God has revealed this wisdom to us through the Holy Spirit. She searches out all things, even the deep things of God. After all, no one knows one's thoughts except one's own inner spirit, by the same token, no one knows God's thoughts except God's Spirit. We haven't received the spirit of the world but the Spirit of God, so that we can understand what God has freely given us. Please remain seated
