¹"The Suburb of Berghäll lies to the north of the charming capital, Helsingfors, and the church erected there dominates the "Djurgården" as the Park of Tölö is called and the land-locked bay which washes its margins. [...] When the church was completed and a carillon placed in the tower, Sibelius was invited to compose a melody in the genuine national vein, that the inhabitants of the district might be constantly reminded of their heritage of song. Sitting one evening in the dusk of the belfry, Sibelius wrote the little homely tune, so calm and strong, with its characteristic fourths and fifths, that is ideally Finnish in sentiment. The simple arrangement for Pianoforte was made by the composer himself for the pleasure of those who live out of earshot of the bells of Berghäll church."

First Reading

First Peter Chapter 2 Verses 19 – 25

¹⁹ For grace is given if you endure unjust punishment for your conscience in the name of God.

²⁰ What credit is there if you patiently endure harsh punishment as a result of your sin? But if you put up with suffering for doing what is right, this is acceptable in God's eyes. ²¹ It was for this that you were called, since Christ suffered for you in just this way and left you an example. You must follow in the footsteps of Christ, ²² who did no wrong, who spoke no deceit, ²³ who did not return insults when insulted, who, when made to suffer, did not counter with threats. Instead, Christ trusted the One who judges justly. ²⁴ It was Christ's own body that brought our sins to the cross, so that all of us, dead to sin, could live in accord with God's will. By Christ's wounds you are healed. ²⁵ At one time you were straying like sheep, but now you have returned to the Shepherd, the Guardian of your souls.

Second Reading Acts of the Apostles Chapter 2 Verses 42 – 47

⁴² They devoted themselves to the apostles' instructions and the communal life, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. ⁴³ A reverent fear overtook them all, for many wonders and signs were being performed by the apostles. ⁴⁴ Those who believed lived together, shared all things in common; ⁴⁵ they would sell their property and goods, sharing the proceeds with one another as each had need. ⁴⁶ They met in the Temple and they broke bread together in their homes every day. With joyful and sincere hearts they took their meals in common, ⁴⁷ praising God and winning the approval of all the people. Day by day, God added to their number those who were being saved.
