The Grace of Jesus Christ be with you **And also with you.**

Please consider these Words of Institution of the Holy Supper of Jesus Christ, as they are delivered by the Apostle Paul:

I have received of Jesus that which I also delivered unto you, that Jesus the same night in which he was betrayed took bread: and when he had given thanks, he *brake* it, and said:

"Take, eat: this is my body, which is broken for you: this do in remembrance of me.

After the same manner also he took the cup, when he had supped, saying, This cup is the New Covenant in my blood: this do ye as often as ye drink it, in remembrance of me.

For as often as ye eat this bread and drink this cup, you shall live in me as I live in you.

And, as the same way in which Jesus did these things, I do them with you.

And so we most humbly beseech unto you ourselves, our souls and bodies to be a reasonable and holy living sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, as, in the communion of all in heaven and on earth, we pray to fulfill us in your [refreshing] love through this meal and the ones to follow.

Prayer of Thanksgiving

Almighty and *everliving* God, we most heartily thank you that in your great Love you have fed us at your table with this spiritual food, and have assured us of your goodness toward us; and that we are members of the Mystical Body of the [Beloved One].

We pray that you assist us with your grace, that we may continue in this holy [assembly], to bring your love forward to all, as glory to you. We pray these things in your name in all the ways that we know you. Amen.
