Scriptural Reading: 1 Kings 19:8b -18

[Elijah] <sup>8b</sup> Strengthened by that food, he traveled for forty days and forty nights until he reached Horeb, the mountain of God. <sup>9</sup> There he went into a cave and spent the night.

And the word of YHWH came to him: "What are you doing here, Elijah?" <sup>10</sup> Elijah replied, "I have been very zealous for YHWH God Omnipotent. The people of Israel have abandoned your covenant, broken down your altars, and put your prophets to death by the sword. I am the only one left, and now they're trying to kill me, too."

<sup>11</sup> God said, "Go out and stand on the mountain in the presence of Yнwн, for Yнwн is about to pass by."

Then a great and powerful wind tore the mountain apart and shattered the rocks by YHWH's power—but YHWH was not in the whirlwind. - <sup>15</sup> Yhwh told Elijah, "Go back the way you came, to the Desert of Damascus. When you get there, anoint Hazael as ruler of Aram. <sup>16</sup> Also anoint Jehu ben-Nimshi as ruler over Israel, and anoint Elisha ben-Shaphat, from Abel Meholah, to succeed you as prophet. <sup>17</sup> Jehu will put to death any who escape the sword of Hazael, and Elisha will put to death any who escape the sword of Jehu. <sup>18</sup> Yet I reserve 7,000 in Israel—all whose knees have not bowed down to Ba'al and all whose mouths have not kissed his images."
